- Worked to keep Carthage safe and clean

- Pushed for the redevelopment of the Ridgewood Business Park on Este Ave.
- Active member of St. Charles Church

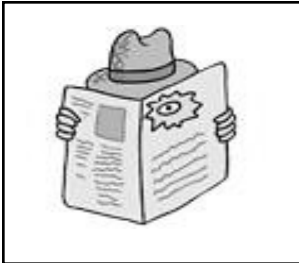
Mission statement

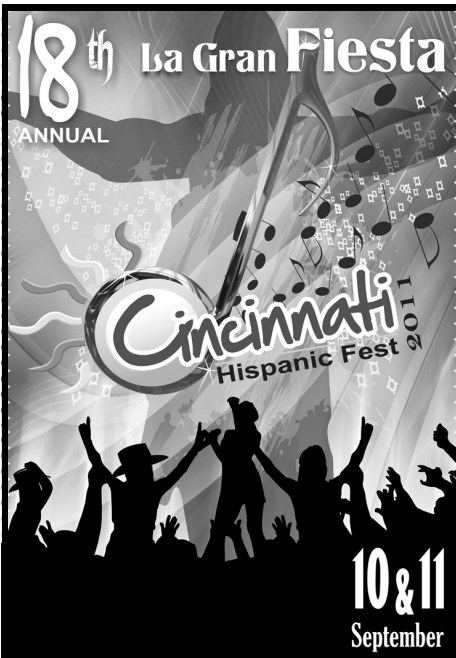

* Latex Paint will be accepted only if resident brings other household hazardous waste. If resident brings only latex paint, resident will be charged \$1.50 per gallon of paint (minimum charge of \$5.00). *Checks or credit cards only - cash NOT accepted.*



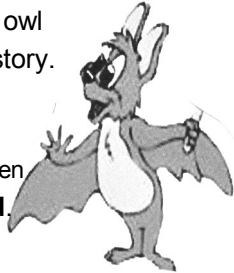

Rediscover Carthage Answer; Carthage Distillery, 7818 Anthony Wayne, opened in 1893. It became the largest producer of whisky in the Cincinnati area. According to the 1894 edition of "The History of Cincinnati and Hamilton County" there were no less than 9 full distilleries and some 58 rectifying plants, rep-

resenting well over \$28 million (1890s) annual dollars worth of commerce, in Cincinnati and its Ohio suburbs. After Prohibition, Cincinnati as a whole never regained its position in the industry.

In August 1933, National Distillery Products Corporation purchased Carthage Distillery. The plant grew becoming the second largest in the United States. 40 thousand gallons of whiskey were produced daily. The distillery, at one point in time, employed 1,400 people and covered over 10 acres. To provide material for the war effort part of it was rebuilt as an industrial (neutral spirits) alcohol distillery in the '40s.

The Distillery began making John DeKuyper & Son cordials and flavored brandies in the mid-1940s The DeKuyper brand is the top-selling cordials line in the world. Production over the years has become mixing and bottling only.

Most of the buildings are no longer owned by National Distillery. In Oct. they will centralize the DeKuyper operation by moving to Ky.

Carthage is happy to be a large part of the distillery history.
