Reports: Police - No report.

Fire - Lt. Dunham from Cincinnati Fire House 2 spoke about safety issues with Thanksgiving Day coming up. He discourages deep frying turkeys because of the great potential for accidents and fires. Also mentioned not leaving food unattended while cooking. He also reminded us about the importance of having smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors on each floor of our homes. Carbon monoxide is odorless. Detectors should be placed 3 to 5 feet away from the furnace. He answered questions about symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning. These detectors are extremely important and will save lives. There were 327 responses run during the past month. 275 were EMT runs, and 52 were fire related. Lt. Dunham also reminded us about smart911.com. When a resident registers on this website, any health issues entered in the system will be made available to first responders before arriving at the residence of the caller. Check out this website.
